Summary of Institution Mission and Student Achievement

Dunlap-Stone University (DSU) strives to offer the highest quality distance education to adult learners by offering Professionally Significant Degrees®, innovative courses, and a student-centered experience in alignment with our commitment to honor, distinction, and excellence in higher education.

Student achievement is measured in a number of ways that reflect the diversity of our adult learners and their individual goals. Program completion and retention rates are important measures of student achievement. However, DSU also understands that our students' goals may or may not include certificate or degree attainment, so we work with each individual to help them achieve personal or professional growth through their enrollment at DSU.

Aggregated Institutional Data on Student Achievement

Institutional Graduation Rate: 67%
Institutional Retention Rate: 84%

Institutional Graduation Rate:

Institutional graduation rates are calculated by reporting program completion within 150% of normal completion time designated by DSU and are based on groups of students who enrolled in a cohort year and are tracked over time. Student cohort rates include full- and part-time students and first time and returning students. 150% of DSU's normal completion time for a certificate time varies by program, for an associate degree is 4.5 years, a bachelor degree is 7.5 years, and a master's degree is 3 years.

Institutional Retention Rate:

The institutional retention rate is an aggregate of students over time. Students within a defined time period who designate a program and remain active in their pursuit of that credential or complete their studies are included. Students who withdraw from the program or fail to make progress are classified as not retained.
